Are your boilers ready for peak use?

As the summer ebbs and fall approaches, it's time to start preparing for winter. Now is a good time to schedule maintenance for your boilers so they will be ready when the cold weather hits and heating demands soar.

Annual maintenance is an important part of keeping your boilers in top performance condition. It is also an insurance company requirement. Failure to inspect a boiler each year is a code violation.

Here are the basic inspection and maintenance steps to take to keep your boilers in peak condition:

Steel Steam Boilers: Oil and Gas

- Open and clean water and firesides of the boiler
- Leave boiler open until it is inspected by your insurance company inspector
- After inspection, close water and firesides and return the boiler to service

Mass. Maritime names steam lab after Wilkinson CEO

Geoffrey C. Wilkinson graduated from Mass. Maritime Academy (MMA) more than 30 years ago but he never really left the Cape Cod college. Over the years he has been a steady supporter and contributor to the school in a variety of ways.

This September MMA will honor him by naming its new steam lab after him. It's the latest honor the school has bestowed on Wilkinson. Last year MMA gave him an honorary doctorate in public administration.

Wilkinson, president and chief executive officer of George T. Wilkinson Inc., is vice chairman of the board of the Massachusetts Maritime Academy Foundation. The foundation generates and manages charitable gifts and is the primary fundraiser for the academy. Wilkinson's company runs two golf tournaments each year to benefit the foundation. In addition, the company hires MMA cadets as interns each year and has hired MMA graduates as permanent employees.

Wilkinson donated the high-pressure boiler that is the heart of the lab.

"Students will learn the practical and the theoretical side of steam generation as it relates to power plants," said Capt. Bradley K. Lima, MMA's academic dean. "This lab is probably unique in its own right. I do not believe there's a similar lab in New England that produces steam in the proper pressure and quantity to operate a condensing steam turbine."

The lab simulates the experience of being aboard ship, Lima said. It has the same catwalks and gratings that are in marine power plants.

"Geoff was given this honor not only because of his donation but for his long-term commitment

to the academy," Lima said. "He exemplifies the MMA alumnus."

MMA trains its students to operate, maintain and manage mechanical operations systems. The new lab helps the school keep up with the real life workplace. The academy and its cadets must adhere to the international training standards for certification set by the International Maritime Organization, based in London.

When the new lab goes into full operation in about a year, MMA students can satisfy 15-percent

to 20-percent of the training experience required by international standards, Lima said.

"I'd be hard pressed to find another person who has done as much as Geoff has for the academy," Lima said. "I've known Geoff for many years. His company name is known as an industry leader, yet he still finds the time to support Mass. Maritime. He's very civically minded and gives back to the community. Geoff has been one classy guy to work with."

Mass. Maritime cadets intern at Wilkinson

Two cadets in the facilities management cooperative program at Massachusetts Maritime Academy spent their summer as interns at George T. Wilkinson, Inc. The students, Eric Crabtree and Paul Better, got to practice what they learn in their courses.
